The deep covers it like a garment; the waters shall stand upon the mountains. Before your rebuke they shall flee; at the sound of your thunder they shall be afraid. PROESTOS:

GLADSOME LIGHT

Thanksgiving at the Lighting of the Lamps

Gladsome light of holy glory of the holy, blessed, heavenly, immortal Father, O Jesus Christ: arriving at the hour of sunset and having seen the evening light, we praise the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, God. It is worthy for you to be praised at all times with happy voices, O Son of God and Giver of life; and therefore the world glorifies you.

DEACON:

The evening. Prokeimenon.

The choirs, beginning with the 1st, chant the prokeimenon of the day.

(Note: On certain feast days, a special prokeimenon may be appointed instead of those below.)

On Sunday Evening – Psalm 133:1

Plagal 4th Mode

Behold now, bless the Lord, all you servants of the Lord. (twice)

Verse: You who stand in the house of the Lord, in the courts of the house of our God. (133:2)

Behold now, bless the Lord, * all you servants of the Lord.



On Monday Evening – Psalm 4:3B

4th Mode

The Lord will hear me when I cry to him. (twice)

Verse: When I called upon you, O God of my righteousness, you heard me; you set me at liberty when I was in distress. Have pity on me, and hear my prayer. (4:1)

The Lord will hear me * when I cry to him.

On Tuesday Evening – Psalm 22:6 1st Mode

Your mercy, O Lord, shall pursue me all the days of my life. (twice)

Verse: The Lord is my shepherd, and I shall not want. He has made me lie down in green pasture. (22:1-2a)

Your mercy, O Lord, shall pursue me * all the days of my life.

Plagal 1st Mode

Save me, O God, by your name, and judge me by your strength. (twice)

Blessed are you, Holy One, enlighten me with your commandments. Lord, your mercy is forever. Do not despise the works of your hands. To you is due praise, to you is due song, to you is due glory, to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Again we pray for mercy, life, peace, health, salvation, protection, forgiveness, and remission of the sins of the servants of God, all pious Orthodox Christians residing and visiting in this city: the parishioners, the members of the parish council, the stewards, and benefactors of this holy church.
- 6. Again we pray for the blessed and ever-memorable founders of this holy church, and for all our fathers and brethren who have fallen asleep before us, who here have been piously laid to their rest, as well as the Orthodox everywhere.
- 7. Again we pray for those who bear fruit and do good works in this holy and all-venerable church, for those who labor and those who sing, and for the people here present who await your great and rich mercy.

IST CHOIR:

Lord, have mercy. (once)

PRIEST:

For you are a merciful God who love mankind, and to you we offer up glory, to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

2ND CHOIR:

THE DISMISSAL

DEACON:
